Rules I must remember...

Charles Darwin Staff and Students will support the new year 7 students with their return to education. They will help with things like....

- Charity events


Student Voice

- Regular meetings to discuss issues and plan events then feedback to form group
- School ambassadors
- 24 hours volunteering during year 7
- Trusted members of the year 7 community
- 2 members go to represent year 7 at school council

Competitions for the whole school

- Achievement points- rewards for regular effort and quality of work in class plus recognition of good character
- 2. Attendance
- 3. Charity Year based

There are 3 ways to be rewarded with Achievement points



ASPIRE points

For directing hopes or ambitions to achieve something through commitment and/or leadership

- √ 3 points Open day guide/helper
- √ 3 points Prefect support at Parents evening
 - √ 5 points Student Voice involvement
- √ 5 points School production rehearsals & show
 - √ 5 points Sports team for term
- √ 5 points School mentor training and commitment
 - √ 10 points School Council for year

ENDEAVOUR points For trying hard to do or achieve something

√ 10 points - Platinum effort for CAPP 1 report

Progress pen nominations and completion of Character passports

ACHIEVE points

For successfully bring about or reaching a desired result

- ✓ Excellent classwork and homework, improved behaviour, noticeable effort and kindness/helpfullness. These are given by teachers through Satchel one for immediate contact with home
 - √ 2 points for Jack Petchey nomination
 - √ 10 points for Jack Petchey winner

Examples of Rewards

- Achievement Points (Aspire, Endeavour, Achieve)
- Letters home
- Certificates
- Attendance Trips
- 'Break with a Cake' Mr Smith
- Jack Petchey award
- Progress Pen
