I would like to thank parents who responded to the 2024 parent survey. This feedback supports us with setting priorities for our school and knowing our strengths. It is pleasing to report all areas improved compared to last year with the most significant being "The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved", 78% of respondents strongly agreed/agreed - an increase of 17% compared to this time last year. Home Learning Day 28th June



Workshops and Presentations for Year 9


