Reading Corner at Charles Darwin


In our recent Y9 assembly we talked about the power of reading, not just in terms of academic success, but also how beneficial reading is for our wellbeing.

When I was young, I hated reading, never picked up a book and believed it was boring. Then when I was 13 years old my grandmother gave me a book and insisted that I read it (Thank you Grandma!). 'I am David' is by Anne Holm. It tells the story of a young boy, born in a prison camp who, with the help of a prison guard, escapes from the camp in an unnamed Eastern European country and has to make his way to Denmark to search for his mother, who had left him many years before. Knowing nothing of the outside world, even what foods to safely eat, he makes his great trek north. Along the way, he meets many people who teach him about life outside the concentration camp. This was more than just a read. It was an experience, and more than 40 years later, I still remember the book and how fortunate I was to have read it. Never say you don't like reading - simply accept you haven't yet found the book that is waiting for you to find it and to change your life.

Workshops and Presentations for Year 9

On Monday 24th June, all students in year 9 will be involved in a series of presentations and workshops as part of our RSE curriculum.

There will a workshop on the dangers of alcohol, drugs and vaping and another on sexual health and contraception. These workshops will be delivered by outside practitioners, Bromley Changes and Bromley Sexual Health as well as Ms Sampson, lead teacher of RSE. 




