We are proud to offer such a wide range of school trips to help students build cultural capital and re-enforce their learning. Last year, we provided over 90 trips across the school, providing invaluable opportunities for our students.

It was a great pleasure to accompany Ms Currie, Ms Sutton and Mr Andrews on a theatre visit Wednesday night to see *The Play That Goes Wrong*. The students and staff thoroughly enjoyed the evening. It was wonderful to hear about students experiencing things for the first time and to receive positive feedback from the public about how mature and inquisitive they were. One gentleman remarked to me that it was a pleasure to be seated near them, noting how engaged they were in discussing their theatrical and London experience during the interval.

We continue to focus on ensuring our students excel in their education. During our inset day on Wednesday, staff participated in sessions on cyber security, safeguarding, and strategies to further support our Year 11 and 13 students as they prepare for their final exams. With the PPEs (mock exams) now complete, we are focusing on responsive teaching.
