
Welcome Back

D-Day 80th Anniversary

On Monday my assembly with the Year 9's was about the D-Day 80th Anniversary. We discussed that D-Day would have been 5th June had it not been for Maureen Sweeney – an Irish postmistress. One of her duties was to make weather observations and on the 3rd June 1944, she discovered a storm and so the attack was postponed for 24 hours. We have taken time to remember the 156,000 British, American and Canadian troops that combined over land, sea and air to turn the direction of the war with incredible bravery and tragic loss of life. We will remember.

Reading Corner at Charles Darwin




Students performed really well across the board and I'm pleased to announce that as a school we achieved 35 Bronze Awards, 21 Silver Awards and 1 Gold Award as well!
